## Yearend Report on Status of ISP Scholars, AY 2015-16 (31 July 2016)

1. Scholars during the academic year: 22

At the end of AY 2014-15, there were twenty-two (22) scholars who passed their respective academic requirements and were expected to enroll for AY 2015-16. All 22 scholars did enroll this year. All of these are 'old' scholars, as no new scholars were taken in this year. There are no first year students for college across the country due to the implementation of the K-12 program that requires 12 years for basic education. First year students will be expected in college only by AY 2018-19.

## 2. Scholars who graduated: 4

Out of the 22 scholars, four (4) were expected to graduate during the school year. All four did graduate, namely:

- 1. Apple BARUZO (BSE, ASC, Apayao)
- 2. Jonalene HANGDAAN (BSE, IfSU, Ifugao)
- 3. Roldan SAB-IT (AB English, UC, Benguet)
- 4. Jherlyn URBANO (BEE, BSU, Benguet)
- 3. Scholars who were dropped from scholarship: 5

There are five (5) scholars who are dropped from the grant this year, namely:

- 1. Cherry DIATEN (BSAc IV, MPSPC, Mtn. Province)
- 2. Erwin John TABORDA (BSAc II, BSU, Benguet)
- 3. Wemie SEGYEP (BSA II, BSU, Mtn. Province)
- 4. Ayson B. LALPUOT (BSF I, BSU, Apayao)
- 5. Wayne Diego A. APIL (BSCE I, KASC/KSU, Kalinga)

The first three were all on probationary status, either during the second semester of AY 2014-15 or the first semester of AY 2015-16. After these, they did not submit their grades anymore. A check with the schools shows that they are still enrolled. They would have either not met the grade requirement or had failing grades and didn't bother to inform us at all as they knew they would already be dropped from the grant as per agreement.

The last two are new scholars this year. They have not turned in their grade reports nor have contacted us after the first semester. Despite repeated follow-ups with them, they have not yet reported to us even after a one-semester allowance.

4. Scholars expected to continue studies next academic year: 13

Thirteen (13) of the scholars this year passed their academic requirements and are expected to enroll for AY 2016-17, which starts this August for most of the schools. All CAR colleges/ universities have shifted their opening to August, except ASIST in Abra. By the way, Kalinga Apayao State College has become a university this year, thus, Kalinga State University.
